BEHIND THE SCENES



SOFIA 2015

This article does not pretend to be a complete report on how we did the WSC/WPC 2015, but only to show what it looked like from my side. Other members of our team did a lot of work, but I was not involved in much of it and thus cannot have first person feelings about it.

THE START

The history of our candidacy for WSC/WPC 2015 started a few years earlier. In 2012 we prepared our application for hosting WSC/WPC 2014. Unfortunately, due to some various family reasons most members of our team had to cancel their participation and the last decided not to go alone. Thus, we skipped the championships in Croatia and the following year in China.

In 2014, when the WPF announced there is still no host for

2015 and it will be selected during GA in London, we decided to refresh our candidacy and apply for it. We presented two location options to the GA: Albena sea resort and Novotel Plovdiv. Most GA members preferred the site to be closer to a big airport, which made Plovdiv the preferred option. After the vote, Bulgaria was selected to host the WSC/WPC 2015 and we started our preparations.

We didn't have the usual two years for preparation, so we had no time to delay. Our first task after we returned home was to secure a hotel, because Plovdiv is a fair city, and hotels are booked for events well in advance. The selected hotel had one main disadvantage, it was available only in the beginning of September. I decided to make a last try to find an option for October and tried checking some other options, like using one of the congress centers

and some nearby hotel. Then I accidentally looked at Ramada Sofia hotel and was surprised that it has significant conference facilities; I was always thinking it's a casino hotel. I contacted the hotel and got an offer that was about 10% more expensive than in Plovdiv. I decided that we can compensate the difference by lower transportation costs and less people to accommodate, because most of us were from Sofia. After some discussions within the team, we decided the site to be moved to Sofia and agreed with the hotel the dates 11-18 October 2015 for the event.

The next task was to set up our team. We divided the responsibilities between members of the initiative committee and my part was the WSC/WPC Director and responsible for puzzles preparation. This ended our initiation phase and routine work started.

PUZZLES

My first job was to establish a puzzle makers team. For our previous hosting of WPC in 2006 I was one of the major contributors of puzzles, but this time I decided I couldn't afford it and concentrated more on organizational work and created some puzzles only when I had some time. Bulgaria does not have enough good puzzle makers, so the most essential part was to attract international contributors and they came from countries like Belarus, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Russia, Thailand and USA.

Having such a varied group of puzzle makers and limited to email contact only might really be a trouble. Splitting the puzzles among several people means that each of them should create about 30 puzzles on average, which does not look like such a huge number, and it always seems there is enough time. The weak point is the person to accept and verify the puzzles. In our case it was me. The non-critical delays in sending puzzles, resulted into a growing pile of puzzles in the beginning of the summer.



My work on puzzles got another obstacle from something that otherwise was quite good for me. After my return from London I was assigned a technical leadership of a big IT project in Pakistan connected with a lot of travel. Till the beginning of the next summer I spent almost four months abroad, which quite limited my ability to work on the puzzles. I succeeded to arrange not to travel during the last three months before the championships, agreed for a part

time work from home for some time and concentrated on finalizing the booklets.

Every single puzzle had to be tested for a correct and unique solution. Wrong puzzles were returned to the authors for correction, then tested again... Sometimes, I corrected the mistakes by myself, where it could have been done easily. I also created some examples where they were missing. I'm glad that the few issues we had with the competition puzzles during the championships were caused by wrong printing and not by wrong puzzles.

Another big part of my work was to make sure all puzzles had the same look. Every author used a different approach to creating the puzzles, different line settings, fonts. In some cases, the puzzles came in low quality bitmaps, drawn by freehand tool, and the most extreme were phone photos of puzzles drawn on a piece of paper.

This huge amount of work became overwhelming and I started failing my own deadlines. The championship was approaching and I still had a heap of completely ready assorted puzzles for WPC that only needed to be arranged into parts, which prevented the WPC instruction booklet to be published in advance.

THE EVENT

The preparation for the championships went very smoothly and without any big issues. No problems with vendors, everything was delivered on time, very easy communication. Hotel staff was very helpful. They met all our needs and we experienced no problems with the hotel and halls. Moreover, we were allowed to use a separate hall for playoffs and avoid the need to rearrange the competition hall.

The hotel location was excellent. With Central Railway



Station and Central Bus Station just across the street, the only issue was the transportation from Sofia airport. We checked the options for available transportation there. But unfortunately, participants were arriving in small groups to two terminals during the entire day, which made this option impractical. Then we decided to pay a bit more, and use taxis only. The most interesting thing was that we never met a single person from the taxi company, everything was completely arranged by a few phone calls and emails.

An important part of the organization are the people to mark the solutions. For this size of a championship, it's good to have at least 30 markers, but 20 may be still ok, although with harder work. Our budget was planned for 20 people staying in the hotel, assuming the rest would prefer sleeping at home. Unfortunately, closer to the championships, many of the puzzlers who previously expressed intent to be part of the team, did not confirm their participation and we started with a team half of the planned size. We asked friends for help and some more people joined us, but it was not enough. My sincere thanks goes to the participants from other countries who decided to spend some of their time and helped our team in marking the puzzles. We cannot thank them personally, but as we believe we should not benefit from our failures, we decided to transfer to WPF the unused budget for organizers team accommodation.



I do not have a lot of memories from the championship, because I was completing the missing assorted booklets to print them before they were needed. There were several issues to handle, but nothing that could make the competition unfair. My biggest regret is that we had to cancel the X-Killer team part of WSC. The side hints table by mistake was replaced by an older version and the correct one was lost and we had not enough time and manpower to create a new one.

There is nothing much more to say, all of us were there. Competitions, playoffs, award ceremonies, Sofia tour and Sofia history museum, football match. And the first 8-hour sleep for months.

Report on the 17th GENERAL

GA meeting part 1 (Thursday)

Opening

The meeting was called to order on Thursday, October 15, at 9.30 a.m. by the WPF Chairman Will Shortz. The second session was held on Thursday evening and was open to all World Sudoku/Puzzle Championship participants. The voting session was held on Friday.

The Board members present were: Will Shortz (Chairman, USA), Chen Cen (CHN), Vítězslav Koudelka (CZE), and Hana Koudelková (Director, CZE). Apologies received from György István (HUN), Alan O'Donnell (UK) and Hans Eendebak (NED). The countries present were Russia, Estonia, Germany, Czech Republic, China, Italy, Turkey, Japan and Belarus.

Reports

The General Assembly Agenda 2015 was approved unanimously as well

as the minutes of the 2014 GA as printed in the WPF Newsletter 20. The financial reports, previously approved by the WPF Treasurer, were presented by Hana.

After approval of the reports, it was decided which points from the agenda would be saved for the open session in the evening.

World Junior Sudoku Championship

The presentation was given by Chen Cen and George Wang. All the members were given a CD with pictures from the first World Junior Sudoku Championship, where there were 39 official participants from nine countries. The venue was a big area in Beijing with a garden museum. Part of the program was a challenge to break the Guinness record in solving the world largest multi-sudoku at the same time. Some 150 local kids joined the official participants and together successfully broke the record.

After the review of 2015, Chen

explained the plans for the future. The biggest issue was that there were not enough countries. According to Chinese rules, if there are not at least 15 countries taking part, it's not possible to call an event a „world championship“ – only an „international tournament.“ Will mentioned the main reasons why most likely there were not more participants this year: It was the first year of this event, it had been announced late, the WPF is more focused on adults, airfares to China are high, and adults need to accompany the kids who compete, adding to everyone's expense. Will also summarized some ideas how to improve the situation next year: to announce the details sooner, for the WPF to publicize the event more, for all WPF members to help with promotion, and for the Chinese hosts to reach out to travel agencies to promote the event.

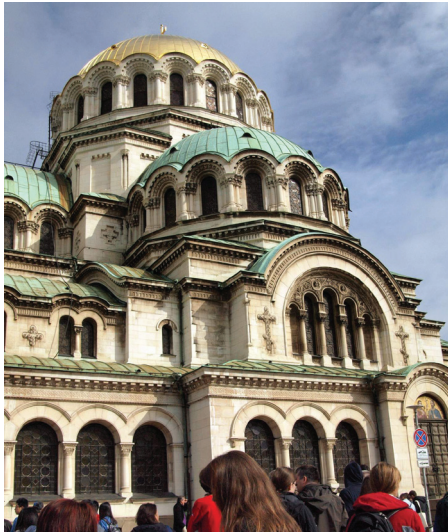
Other members were asked how they felt about attending. Vita (CZE) said that some parents would not allow

their youngsters to travel to China. Johannes Susen (GER) mentioned that Germany would be hosting the 1st Junior Sudoku Championship in Germany and he hopes to have some players and sponsors for next year. This year money was the main reason why there was no player from Germany. Jaanus Laidna (EST) reported that in Estonia there had been a Sudoku Olympiad for two years with three age groups and many participants, but unfortunately none were interested in going to China. Andrey Bogdanov (RUS) confirmed that four Russian players were there and very much enjoyed themselves. Meishuku Ishimura (JPN) said they could not afford to send a team to China. Cenan Denizer (TUR) promised to try to send some players next year. Alida Cernogoraz (ITA) said that Italian youth were not greatly interested in sudoku. At the end of the discussion Vita asked Chen Cen if there was a chance that also an adult accompanying the kid could have no

participation fee. The Chinese team will discuss this and let us know.

World Junior Puzzle Championship

Cenan presented a Turkish proposal to host a World Junior Puzzle Championship in Istanbul, for five years starting in 2017. For almost 10 years, Türk Beyin Takimi has been organising competitions in different



schools in Turkey. These competitions appeal to the age group 8-18. The main competitions have been Math Symposium (510 students from 170 schools), Istanbul puzzle competition for high schools (900 students from 300 schools), Istanbul Sudoku competition for secondary schools (750 students from 250 schools), etc. Türk Beyin Takimi would take care of the whole organization of the championship. They have a sponsoring school for the championship – ISTEK College in Istanbul – and have been

negotiating with Turkish Airlines about sponsorship. It was agreed that the Turkish team would prepare more details (dates, fees, age categories, types of puzzles) for future discussion.

WSC/WPC Host

Alida (ITA) said there was a chance for Italy to host the 2018 WSC/WPC in San Marino. They have started discussions regarding a venue there and would get back to us with more details.

Open GA meeting part 2
(Thursday evening)

Candidates for the WPF Board

This year there were two candidates for the one open position on the Board. The candidates were Gareth Moore (GBR) and Vladimir Portugalov (BLR). During the meeting Vladimir cancelled his candidacy, so there was only one candidate – Gareth. He gave a short presentation that included his experience, current job, and future plans for the WPF.

Number of Board positions

Vita proposed to reduce the number of Board members back to five as was the case prior to 2013 (starting 2016).

WSC/WPC 2016 Slovakia

The presentation was done by Matúš Demiger and Zuzana Hromcová, the WSC/WPC 2016 directors.

The championships will be held on October 16-23, 2016, in Senec (30 km from Bratislava). The authors and organisers are Matúš, Zuzana, Peter Hudák, Blanka Lehotská, Matej Uher, and Ivana Štiptová. The official participation fees will be: WSC – 340 €, WPC – 400 €, WSC+WPC – 550€.

Candidate for hosting WSC/WPC 2017 – India

For 2017 there was only one candidate – India. Amit Sovani and his team gave a presentation. First he introduced Logic Masters India, their activities, and contributions to the WPF and the puzzle community. As for the WSC/WPC the venue would be in the city Bangalore, and currently there are two offers for the hotel. The fees proposed were: WSC – 300 €, WPC – 400 €, WSC+WPC – 550 €. The core organisers would be Amit, Deb Mohanty, Prasanna Seshadri, Rakesh Rai, Rohan Rao, and Sumit Bothra. After the presentation there was time for questions. György István asked how many volunteers they would have for the championships. The Indian team currently has about 15 volunteers in their team.

World Junior Sudoku Championship Will summarized the output from the regular GA meeting and again asked the country representatives about their feelings and asked them to publicize this event.

World Junior Puzzle Championship

The idea was presented to the players,

and some familiar puzzle types were mentioned, like jigsaw puzzles, mazes, find the differences, etc.

Guidebook

Vita presented the idea to have an official document for future WSC/WPC hosts. The draft version was prepared by Vita and posted on the WPF forum. All the participants were invited to go through it and add comments and proposals. Methods of forcing the hosts to follow the rules were discussed. György suggested having an emergency backup plan if a host was not following the rules, such as having the championship prepared by the WPF in an inexpensive country on short notice. This could also work as a tool to motivate a host to follow the rules. He also expressed his disappointment with the course of this year's major WPF event and regretted the WPF did not prevent the occurred situation.

Closing

Will thanked Deyan Razsadov for hosting the WSC/WPC 2015, Alan O'Donnell for his service in the WPF Board, Hana Koudelková for several years as the WPF Director, and Wei-Hwa Huang and Thomas Snyder for running the WPF Sudoku/Puzzle GP. There being no further business, the meeting was closed on Thursday October 16.

Voting Session (Friday)

The Board members present were:

Will Shortz (Chairman, USA), Chen Cen (CHN), Vítězslav Koudelka (CZE), György István (HUN), Alan O'Donnell (UK), and Hana Koudelková (Director, CZE). The countries present were: Romania, Korea, China, Czech Republic, Finland, Greece, Slovakia, Japan, United Kingdom (also voting on behalf of Canada), Poland, Estonia, Germany, France, Switzerland, USA, Italy, India, Hungary, Serbia, Netherlands (voting by email), and Serbia (voting by email). Ballots were distributed with the following topics:

1. Board member: There was one candidate – Gareth Moore (GBR). The vote was unanimous, and Gareth was elected as a new WPF Board member.
2. Number of Board members: The proposal was to reduce the number of Board members back to the original number (five) starting in 2016. There were 18 votes in favour, no vote opposed, and 4 abstentions. So starting next year the WPF Board will consist of five people.
3. Candidates for hosting WSC/WPC 2017: There was one candidate – India. The vote was whether to select India as the host country for 2017 or to delay the decision. The vote for India was unanimous, and India will host the WSC/WPC 2017.

Board Meeting (Tuesday)

The meeting was called to order on Tuesday and the Board members present were: Will Shortz (Chairman, USA), Chen Cen (CHN), Vítězslav Koudelka (CZE), György István (HUN), Alan O'Donnell (UK), and Hana Koudelková (Director, CZE). Apologies

received from Hans Eendebak (NED).
WSC/WPC 2015 - Update

Deyan Razsadov (BLG), director of the WSC/WPC 2015, was invited for the first part of the meeting. Some issues were discussed, help offered by the WPF, and next steps and deadlines agreed.

The Board went through the GA agenda and discussed all the topics.

WSC/WPC Host - WPF's support

The Board discussed ways to help expensive countries to host the championships. Alan proposed establishing a reserve fund, by increasing the fee for an „inexpensive“ country, for instance, from 400 to 600 EUR, with 200 EUR of that being saved. Then a host from an „expensive“ country that might need to charge 800 EUR could charge just 600 EUR, with the remaining 200 EUR coming from the fund. This was not discussed further. Will emphasized that there is no limit for the participation fee. Each host can propose any fee it wants, and members are free to choose any site they wish, taking all factors, including cost, into consideration. Vita suggested not subsidizing the championship, but to find a mechanism for having greater diversity in championship sites.

National qualifications

Alan suggested making it compulsory for members to hold national qualifier competitions each year. Will proposed only to encourage them.

Online platform

Hans suggested that the WPF provide an online platform for members that have online competitions. It was agreed that this was a good idea and could be a nice benefit for members. Alan promised to talk to Wei-Hwa and see if this is possible and, if so, what needs to be done to make it happen. Alan offered his UK platform for this purpose, too.

On a related topic, György suggested preparing a software for future WSC/WPC hosts that would include a timing system, countdown, online results on the WPF web page in a constant format, and eventually software for the playoffs. This was approved. Hana will prepare a list of requirements and ask all the members if there is anybody willing to help with the work.

Guidebook

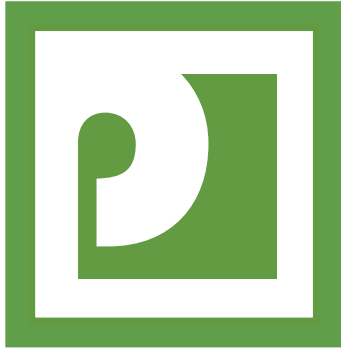
It was decided that the WPF Guidebook draft would be available on the WPF forum, and everybody will be asked to check it and add comments or proposals.

Board Meeting (Friday)

The Board Meeting took place immediately after the voting session. Gareth Moore was welcomed as a new Board member.

György proposed having a set of goals for the WPF Board to achieve during the coming year. It was agreed that the top priority is the WPF Guidebook. The guidebook has now been published

online in the WPF forum, and members are asked to go through it and add their comments. The comments and suggestions will be collected by the end of January. After this date Vita is asked to sum up all the points and provide the Board with an updated version of the guidebook. The deadline for the final version to be approved by the Board is March 31. In terms of requiring WPC/WSC hosts to follow WPF rules, Gareth suggested that WPC/WSC registration fees should be paid to the WPF so that the WPF would hold some financial leverage over hosts, releasing money only when evidence of completing various stages was given. This would also require teams to register and pay further in advance, which would allow hosts to plan for precise numbers sooner, given that they can vary by about 50 people from year to year, and more easily pay the various deposit amounts required by hotels. It was instead agreed that the WPF should simply encourage hosts to follow the rules, but there should be no financial enforcement of this, and that there was no need to encourage people to register early. It was agreed to prepare a schedule outlining things that need to be done by the host during the one-year period before the championship. György was asked to prepare a proposal by the end of January. This material will be added to the Guidebook. Later on the officers were selected. Will Shortz was re-elected as the WPF chairman, Hans Eendebak as treasurer and Vítězslav Koudelka as the competition director for 2016.



WPF SUDOKU/PUZZLE GRAND PRIX 2015

WPF GP 2015 was the 3rd year of running the Sudoku Grand Prix and 2nd year of the Puzzle GP. As the past years, the GP Directors were Thomas Snyder (USA) for Sudoku GP and Wei-Hwa Huang (USA) for Puzzle GP. This year the puzzles were prepared by the following WPF member countries - Netherlands, Russia, India, Poland, Serbia, Czech Republic, Italy, United Kingdom, Slovakia, Turkey, USA, Germany, Switzerland and Japan. Compared to the previous years, the number of puzzle rounds was increased to 8 in 2015. Only top six results for each solver were included in his or her final WPF Grand Prix ranking. The format of the tournament was paper-solving with transcription of solutions.

At the end of the Grand Prix, the top 10 Sudoku GP solvers and top 10 Puzzle GP solvers were invited to the WSC/WPC 2015 to play off in person.

For the first time this year, WPF decided to appraise also a fantastic job all the puzzle makers did and announced the Most Popular Sudoku/Puzzle Round based on the results of the Survey held on the GP web page. The best Puzzle round was prepared by the German team and the best Sudoku round by the Indian team.

At the end of this year's GP, WPF Puzzle GP Director, Wei-Hwa Huang said:

„My vision for the GP is to have a competition that is fun for all puzzle-solvers, and not just the top few competitors in every country like the WPC.“

This will be the main change for the next GP 2016. Each Puzzle Round will contain two sections, a Casual section and a Competitive section. The Competitive section will contain culture-neutral, logically-solvable puzzles, similar to those seen in previous Puzzle GPs and the WPC. The Casual section will contain puzzles with easy-to-understand instructions but need not be culture-neutral; the purpose is for puzzle designers to provide entertaining puzzles that may not be appropriate for serious competition.

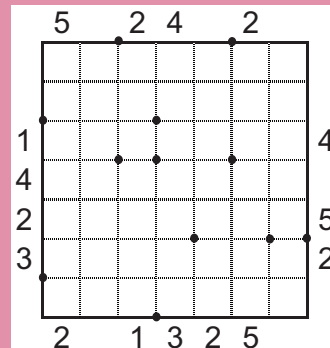
